## Profile of a KMC Graduate at Graduation

A little more than two years ago, we embarked on the implementation of our Strategic Plan to guide us through a roughly five-year period of growth and development. The Strategic Plan directed us to leverage our strengths, focus on our opportunities for improvement and more intentionally crystallize our core mission to be dedicated to the education and formation of the total person in the image of Jesus Christ. The plan challenged us to rethink many aspects of our school and its operations and to resolve firmly to move our school forward in these times when technology and differentiated instruction heighten our alertness to the challenges of education.



One of the central strategies of the Strategic Plan is the KMC Graduate Profile. In developing our Graduate Profile, we have been challenged to think about our expectation of the KMC graduate. What should a graduate of KMC look like, act like, think like, pray like?

Of course, the Graduate Profile must fit within our core mission, and it must reflect the spirituality of Stewardship upon which our school has been built and under which it flourishes today. Accordingly, in developing our Graduate Profile, we started with an overriding objective of partnering with our families and parishes to educate and form in the image of Jesus persons who utilize their God-given gifts and talents in the service of others.

In meeting this overriding objective, we have focused our Graduate Profile on five main categories of development and formation. These five main categories help us to sharpen our focus as we continue the work of fostering and facilitating the growth of our students. Although these five categories can be separated for purposes of description, they are interrelated and represent a unified, mutually dependent educational and formational process.

What follows is the KMC Graduate Profile. It is a living document that will be refined as we continue to achieve the goals of our Strategic Plan and beyond. We are proud of our graduates, and we strive to instill in each of them the tenets of this profile. The Kapaun Mt. Carmel graduate is:

### **OPEN TO GROWTH**

The Kapaun Mt. Carmel graduate takes intentional responsibility for his or her own growth. The graduate strives to grow in the realization and use of his or her talents. The graduate shows promise in the understanding that leadership is a vehicle of growth for the graduate and others.

The graduate embraces learning and desires it more; consequently, he or she desires learning as a life-long process to develop imagination, feelings, conscience and intellect. The graduate is open to accepting and offering constructive criticism. The graduate is willing to risk new experiences and recognizes them as opportunities to grow. A close relationship with God enables him or her to nurture such openness.

### **INTELLECTUALLY COMPETENT**

The Kapaun Mt. Carmel graduate is encouraged to exhibit a mastery of academic skills for advanced education and development of character. The graduate is trained in basic study and research skills so that he or she is prepared for life-long creative learning. The graduate is developing an aesthetic capacity.

The graduate exhibits intellectual integrity and honesty. The graduate's repertoire of knowledge enables him or her to view his or her community in a compassionate and hopeful way. Similarly, the graduate is developing a critical consciousness which enables him or her to analyze and question the issues facing our society. The graduate is learning that different branches of knowledge provide more ways to discern truth.

### **RELIGIOUS**

The Kapaun Mt. Carmel graduate knows that God loves him or her, and the graduate returns that love through prayer and service. The graduate has developed a capacity for personal encounters with God and has reflected on these encounters in prayer. The graduate recognizes the work of God in others. The graduate seeks to develop a personal faith and is aware that the Catholic Church is an instrument to aid personal religious development.

### **A PERSON FOR OTHERS (LOVING)**

The Kapaun Mt. Carmel graduate is seeking to understand and to love himself or herself as well as others. The graduate is developing compassion for others by respecting diversity. The graduate's relationships are deepening as he or she tries to move beyond self-interest and to disclose himself or herself, accepting the mystery of other persons and cherishing these persons. The graduate is not a fully confident, loving adult, yet he or she is beginning to integrate his or her interests, concerns, feelings, and sexuality into his or her whole personality. The graduate, to the best of his or her abilities, gives himself or herself to others in service and is becoming sensitive to the beauty and fragility of the created universe.

### **COMMITTED TO JUSTICE**

The Kapaun Mt. Carmel graduate is developing a strong sense of the dignity and equality of all persons and respects all people, regardless of race, sex, religion or ethnic background. The graduate has begun to acquire skills toward improving his or her world, whether that be through family, further study, his or her interaction with authority, both public and private, or in his or her chosen career. The graduate is beginning to understand individual and structural injustices and promotes just actions.

In working toward a just world, the graduate is preparing to contribute his or her gifts and talents explored and developed at Kapaun Mt. Carmel to his or her community. The graduate has attained a level of awareness that he or she must be an active participant in advancing God's kingdom.

## We Are Inspired.

### What inspires every act of generosity is a story unique to each donor...

The Crusader Annual Fund is bringing positive change to halls of Kapaun Mt. Carmel in ways that sometimes go sight unseen. Sometimes it is seen in projects like the newly updated softball field, the TVs in the commons, and the soon to be installed digital marquee. More often than not, however, it is seen in the classroom, the retention of a favorite teacher or enhancements to technology or security, which are integrated without huge fan fair.

Your gifts to the Crusader Annual Fund make those dreams a reality. So far in the 2018-19 year, gifts add up to \$345,397 in operating support from more than 40% of our current KMC families, and hundreds of alumni, parents of alumni, grandparents and friends of the school. Thank you to all who have donated thus far. All these contributions have an immediate impact on the quality of the school and directly benefit KMC students.

In a recent survey, KMC parents were asked a few questions in regard to their knowledge around the Crusader Annual Fund. 90% of survey participants understand how the Crusader Annual Fund supports the school and our mission. The next question was trying to identify reasons why more than 50% of our families don't donate to the Crusader Annual Fund. While some parents say they forgot, the top two answers were that the parents already give to KMC in other ways, and that donating to their church is enough.

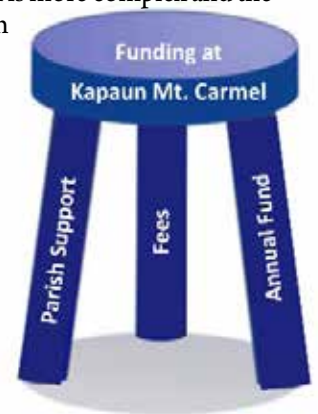
For those that forgot, we've got you covered! In a couple weeks, our semi-annual Crusader Annual Fund Phone-a-thon will start back up. If you have not been able to donate to the CAF yet, we will be calling to ask for your support. We hope all parents will join us in making a donation to benefit the educational opportunities of your student.

For those that say they do not give annually, here's some food for thought and hopefully some points of clarification on where the money goes, why it's critical to our success and how it benefits all 900 students at KMC.

### Q: Why does KMC have an Annual Fund?

Simply put, it takes significant resources to operate a Catholic high school; even more than a parochial primary or middle school. The high school is larger, the curriculum is more complex and the needs of the faculty are more extensive in the high school setting.

The education income that KMC receives from its feeder parishes, all of which comes from the tithing of the faithful, does not fully cover the costs of a Catholic high school education. Like other parochial high schools, KMC relies on donations to help meet annual operating expenses.



The Crusader Annual Fund goal is \$450,000 to cover our Crusade:

- \$5,500: Average support from parish and student fees
- \$6,000: Basic cost to educate a KMC student each year
- \$500:** Remainder per student covered by the Crusader Annual Fund

For 2018-19, the gap between educational income from parish tithing and expenses was \$450,000 or about 8% of the budget. \$6,000 is the basic cost per student and on average, we receive \$5,500 from parish support, fees and other revenue, leaving a

\$500 gap per student. Annual giving helps fill this gap.

### Q: What does the Crusader Annual Fund do for KMC?

A: The Crusader Annual Fund provides resources for the operating budget, which supports everything from the latest technology and hardware, to the best teaching tools and classroom equipment, athletic and arts programs, safety and security for the campus, maintenance and upkeep, financial assistance, as well as faculty salaries and compensation (maybe the most important!)-all aspects of the school from the nitty-gritty to the inspiring.

## **Q: I tithe through my church, why am I asked to give more?**

A: By helping to cover the gap between the actual cost to educate a student at the school each year and parish support, your gift to the Crusader Annual Fund directly influences the educational experience students have at KMC. The availability of more resources equals access to more educational tools. It's the difference between good and great. Also, contributions to KMC are tax-deductible, whereas fees are not. When you donate to the Annual Fund, you help keep fees lower and your gifts could entitle you to a tax benefit.

From the foundation of the United Catholic Stewardship model for educational funding, the intention was for the Catholic high schools, which are not owned by a parish, (as opposed to the primary and middle schools that are directly connected to a parish), to have three funding sources:

- Parish direct support and subsidy (your tithe to your parish)
- Fees (i.e. tuition of non-Catholic students, grants, athletic/activity charges)
- Development, primarily from the Annual Fund and other donations

Some illustrate it as a three-legged stool- without all the legs, it would surely fall.
